FROM THE CHAIR – JUNE 2002

Let me begin by extending a warm welcome to the new Cursillistas from Cursillos 103 and 104. Your excitement for the Lord was clearly evident at the Fourth Day program held at St. Alban's on May 4th. I am energized by the fellowship of Christians who are excited about their lives in Christ. It is that kind of positive energy that changes environments; it is the radiant light of Christ that overcomes the darkness of the world.

I'm sure most have heard the analogy of the burning coal that when removed from the fire loses its glow and when placed back into the fire begins to glow again. It is in the Christian community that we are sustained in our journey with the Lord. The two most important tools we have available are Grouping and Ultreya. It is in our weekly group that we are held accountable to live a life of piety, study, and action. Regular Ultreyas are the places where we are encouraged by the witnesses of those around us.

I certainly hope and pray that all this sounds familiar to you because it is the essence of the Cursillo movement. The purpose of Cursillo is to equip Christians to live out their Fourth Day by changing their environments (home, Church, and work) for Christ. Are you actively involved in your local parish? If not, I encourage you to find a ministry that complements your spiritual gifts. Cursillo does not exist to siphon off talent from the local parishes; quite the contrary. Cursillo should energize the ministries of the local parishes with fresh Christian leadership.

Above and beyond your ministry in the Church, we need your help in the Cursillo movement. There are many different committees where you can serve. If you would like to be involved, please call me or anyone on the Secretariat. We will find a place where your God given talents can be used to serve the kingdom.

The recreation and the revival of the Cursillo Servant Community is a cause for great rejoicing, especially among the members of the Diocesan Secretariat! Stay with us and then we shall begin to shine as you shine, so to shine as to be the light to others. The light, O Jesus, will be all from you. None of it will be ours. It will be you shining on others through us. Let us thus praise you in the way you love best by shining on those around us. Let us preach you without preaching; not by words, but by our example, by the catching force, the sympathetic influence of what we do, the evident fullness of the love our hearts bear to you."

The present site of Camp Stevens was purchased in 1952 by two visionary clergymen, Revs. Jack Lax and C. Boone Sadler, representing the San Diego Convocation. It eventually became the official diocesan camp of the Diocese of Los Angeles, which, at that time, included what is now the San Diego Diocese.

For 50 years Camp Stevens has been serving young people, families and adults in a "peaceful place apart". Programs have expanded from a few weeks of summer camp to a year-round camp and conference center with programs for all ages. It is a Jubilee Center of the National Episcopal Church with an emphasis on environmental stewardship.

Over this half-century so many have given so much to sustain and strengthen the mission and ministry of this "place apart". Please join in celebrating their accomplishments, rejoicing in what Camp Stevens is, and together committing to build on the foundations laid by all the others who came before.

"A SOUL IS PRECIOUS"

This is a true story of how God intervened in a person's life to show His love and grace by using an unsuspecting, but available witness.

I am not a very sentimental person, but every now and then I happen to notice and appreciate the beauty God provides us through nature. One morning as I walked out the door heading for work early one morning. I noticed a rose bud at eye level. It was sparkling with dew in the early morning sunlight, and it was beautiful. I could not resist sharing this prize of beauty with someone, in fact I thought a lot of people should see this rose, so I cut it and carefully rapped in a moist towel and tinfoil. I took it to work with me to show everyone.

After arriving at work I realized putting it on my desk would not be very beneficial, because not many people would see it. Suddenly I realized that our receptionist was leaving us in order to move to Oregon and take care of her mother who had Alzheimer's. She was very sad about leaving, but she had decided that there was no one else to take care of her. Since she was leaving at the end of the day, because she was sad, and because she was the receptionist (this made her the obvious person to receive the rose). It could be displayed to everyone who walked by, and it was a nice little thought. I was so proud of myself for being so clever, but I also remember thinking it was just luck, because this was really out of character for me.

I put the rose on her desk and thought that it should be anonymous, mainly because this was not really my idea, but just a lucky set of circumstances, but I thought it would be nice to tell her she would be missed and that she was doing a good thing, so I decided to write a little note to go along with the rose. I opened up my text processor and began to write:

Dear Brenda,

This is your last day with us and we just want to thank you for all of your hard work and support you have given us this past year. You will be missed, but we know that you are doing the right thing and we admire you for doing it. It may be difficult for you at times, but we hope you can be comforted in knowing that what you do is a gift of love.

This rose is a Peace rose and it reminds me of a scripture passage that may help you during the time you spend with your mother. It is John 14:27 and is: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be

afraid." I hope that you find that peace that passes all understanding as you care for your mom and give her your gift of love.

Now I was really proud of myself for being so clever and thoughtful, even if it was purely accidental. I placed the note with the rose and promptly forgot about the whole thing.

About three years after this event I was working in my office one day when there was a knock on the door. There stood this person who looked vaguely familiar, but I couldn't place her right away. She came in and gave me a big hug and said she just wanted to thank me for leading her to Christ. I was totally lost at this point, because I would have thought that if I had led anyone to Christ I certainly would remember them. As she told me about the rose and her last day at work I realized who she was and my role in her conversion.

Brenda began reading the Holy Bible when she arrived in Oregon, because of the note. It had led her to a relationship with Christ. Her mother was now deceased, but she knew her mother was with the Lord and that she was a growing and loving Christian. It was amazing to me and very humbling that God had used me in my ignorance to introduce someone to our Lord without my conscious effort. This was additional proof to me that God is in charge and He will use us if we make ourselves available. A single soul is very precious to Him and he will use us to bring others to Him if only we are available.

I hope as you read this story you could see how God can work through you as His witness.

SPONSORSHIP

The next set of weekends may seem like a long way off but it is not too early to consider sponsoring somebody to Cursillo. I say that it is not too early because so much thought and prayer needs to go into sponsorship. You need to ask yourselves the following questions:

First, whom should you sponsor?

Is your prospective candidate a practicing Christian? Is your candidate searching for ways to live his/her life more effectively for Christ? Is the candidate a leader or potential leader in the ministry of the Church? Is he/she an Episcopalian? And is he/she physically and emotionally able to fully participate in the whole Weekend?

Second, what have you already done for your candidate?

Have you spoken to God about whom you should sponsor? Have you listened for His reply? Have you spoken to your Rector or Vicar about your candidate? Have you actually *been* a friend to your candidate? Remember: First, Make a friend; Then, Be a friend; and Finally, Bring your friend to Christ. Have you discussed Group Reunion with your candidate? Have you talked to him/her about Ultreya? Have you brought him/her to a Group Reunion or Ultreya? Have you told your candidate everything he/she needs to know about the weekend? Is your candidate able to participate in the 4th Day program?

For the weekend you need to commit to:

- Praying/fasting for your candidate.
- Sacrificing for them.
- Helping to arrange for the care of family, pets, and plants during the weekend.
- Writing palanca notes for your candidate about the prayer and fasting taking place for them.
- Getting his/her friends and family to write palanca notes.
- Arranging to take your candidate to the weekend.
- Don't just drop them at the door. Take them up to the dining hall and introduce them to those you know. Stay there until the sponsors are asked to leave. Remember how you felt when your sponsor left on Thursday night.

During the weekend remember to:

- Pray/fast
- Sacrifice
- Attend Mananitas and the Closing Service and take him/her home.

Your candidate is now a Cursillista. Your job is not done with taking him/her home following the weekend. After the weekend you will need to:

- Contact him/her soon after the weekend.
- Accompany him/her to the 4th Day program
- Make sure he/she gets into a Group Reunion
- Take him/her to an Ultreya

Sponsorship is a commitment of support to the Cursillista long after the 3-Day Weekend. Seem like a big job? It is. That's why this article is so important. We need to be reminded that Sponsorship is a vital part of Cursillo. A good sponsor can make all of the difference in a person's 4th day. So pray about sponsoring. Pray about whom you should sponsor. Pray about IF you should sponsor. Then if God gives the go-ahead, go out and speak to your friend about Cursillo.

CANDIDATE APPLICATION

CURSILLO is Spanish for short course in Christian living. The 'short course' consists of a Three-day Weekend and a separate "Fourth Day". A team of laity and clergy present the fundamental principles of Christian living through a series of talks and meditations.

Your sponsor believes you have leadership qualities, and have the potential to change your environments for Christ. The weekend is designed to provide leadership training while reaffirming your commitment to the Lord Jesus Christ. After the weekend, there is a continuing program in which you are encouraged to participate.

Since both this weekend and the subsequent involvement are demanding, we ask you to pray seriously about your application before you submit it. Acceptance is not automatic for a specific weekend, but will be prayerfully considered. Once the Pre-Cursillo committee determines the candidate's participation in the upcoming weekend will be beneficial, the candidate will receive notice of acceptance. If your application is accepted, but you are unable to attend the designated weekend, your application will remain active for two upcoming weekends.

In order to gain the most from the weekend, you should be in the best possible spiritual, emotional and physical condition.

Husband and wife should apply at the same time. **HUSBAND MAKES CURSILLO FIRST**, and the wife makes hers one week later.


