From the Spiritual Director...

**We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord,
the Giver of Life.**

The Nicene Creed

These words from the Nicene Creed imply that the Holy Spirit is God and the giver of all life, both natural and supernatural. The Spirit swept over the waters in Genesis 1:2, helping form the creation and bringing natural life into existence. On the day of Pentecost the Holy Spirit again came to re-create people, filling them with the supernatural life of the risen Christ. The Holy Spirit is the giver of Jesus' risen life to anyone who is willing to believe that "Christ is risen."

On the day of Pentecost Jews were gathered in Jerusalem to celebrate the Jewish festival of Pentecost, the feast of weeks, a holiday that fell 50 days after Passover, to celebrate the giving of the Jewish law and the birth of the Jewish nation. (Exodus 34:22) They were devout Jews from many nations; the Holy Spirit came upon them and brought new and supernatural life. They could hear the Gospel being preached each in their own tongues. The Spirit was bringing the presence of the risen Christ into them, re-creating them into new people and forming them into the church. Please take the time to read Acts chapter 2, everyone should read the Pentecost account very carefully. It is a creation story; it should be a story that calls to mind how the Holy Spirit has been re-creating you. The Holy Spirit should be your giver of life, you should know of the supernatural work of the Spirit in your life. You may not have experienced the miracle of hearing the Gospel in different languages, but every time the Spirit stirs inside of us it is a miracle, some life beyond natural life enters the depths of our being and re-creates us and moves us into a new stage of life. Every Christian should know the Holy Spirit as the giver of life and be able to tell our own Pentecost stories. The first Pentecost of the coming of the Holy Spirit is just the first of many comings of the Holy Spirit. Pentecost is a re-occurring event, the Holy Spirit should come at many different times and ways to give us life. Do you have your own Pentecost story when the Holy Spirit worked a miracle in you and became your giver of life?

THE DENNIS FOWLE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The Dennis Fowle Memorial Scholarship Fund was established following his death in 1998. His wife, Connie, and his four children, Christopher, Andrew, Timothy and Jessica, could think of no better way to use the gracious and generous gifts sent to the family at that time. Dennis strived to have his children comprehend the value of an education and hard work; this ethic is so instilled in them that they want it to be valued and remembered.

The Cursillo Community was selected as the recipient of this gift because of Dennis's involvement in Cursillo, New Beginnings and Happening, all ministries that were very dear to him.

One five hundred dollar scholarship will be awarded at the end of September. An application for that scholarship is enclosed in this newsletter. To be eligible for the award a student must:

1. Be the child or grandchild of a member of the San Diego Episcopal Diocese Cursillo Community.
2. Be currently enrolled in a vocational, community or 4-year college.
3. Have completed the first full year of their study program.
