CANDIDATES – DO NUMBERS MATTER?

At the April 4 team meeting for Cursillo Weekend # 126, we had a discussion about numbers of candidates for our weekend(14 are confirmed for the weekend) and "do numbers matter?" I would like to address the question, and receive inputs to share with all in the next Forward edition.

Numbers from a financial focus: With Bishops Lodge once again available for our use on a weekend, our Camp Stevens cost has returned to a discounted rate of approx. \$4,800 for the four day weekend. With an average weekend cost for everything else equal to approximately \$2,000 including food, the total weekend financial exposure is approx. \$6,800. With a donation of \$110 for each attendee, we need about 68 people attending the weekend, team members and candidates, to break even. We were usually having team sizes of 50, and 15-to 25 candidates(an average of 70) for a weekend, and were basically in a break even situation. We now average 35 team members and 20 candidates for a weekend for a total of 55 leaving us with a financial short fall. You can do the math. We currently have 38 team members and 14 candidates committed to #126, for a total of 52. We have the same situation.

So, from a financial focus, if asked, does it make sense to have more team members and candidates for the weekend, the answer is "yes".

Numbers from a Godly focus: We firmly believe that God is in charge of the weekends, and it is He that that decides who is ready to come, who will come, and how many will come to the weekend. As for team members and numbers, He has inspired the Cursillo Secretariat to call a Rector, or Rectora, to lead the weekend, and assemble a team in his name. As for the Candidates, He has inspired them to be receptive to an invitation from a friend and Sponsor to attend a weekend. As for the Sponsors, he has inspired them to seek out those He has called to attend a weekend, to prepare the way, and to bring them to the weekend to be in His presence.

So, when we say: There is still time to Sponsor a Candidate to the Spring Weekend, we are not second guessing God on how many he has called to be there. We are asking those with the gift to be Sponsors, and have been inspired to seek out those God has called, to focus, to pray for guidance, and to seek and re-seek those still waiting to be asked to attend Cursillo Weekend #126.

And how do I know all the above is relevant? On Saturday, at the team meeting, within minutes of an appeal for additional Candidates, Sponsors identified three potential Candidates they believed were waiting to be asked to go on the weekend.
