


#### A MESSAGE FROM THE CURSILLO SECRETARIAT PRESIDENT

## Craig Noble

#### One of the Greatest Prayers

Almighty God, give us grace to cast away the works of darkness, and put on the armor of light, now in the time of this mortal life in which your Son Jesus Christ came to visit us in great humility; that in the last day, when he shall come again in his glorious majesty to judge both the living and the dead, we may rise to the life immortal; through him who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen

This collect for the First Sunday of Advent is one of the greatest prayers ever written. Found in the Book of Common Prayer, page 211, it focuses on both the humility and majesty of Christ. Jesus Christ came in "great humility" during his first coming in Bethlehem and will come again in "glorious majesty" in his second coming at the end of time. The contrast between *great humility* and *glorious majesty* is very important. Jesus came to us in his birth in the manger in great humility on that first Christmas morning. Our salvation depends on us welcoming the humble Jesus into our hearts with great humility ourselves. Only people who can humble themselves before Jesus will be saved. And only those who humble themselves before Jesus will be able to participate in his glorious majesty when he comes again.

The first parts of the prayer focus on *humility*:



"Give us grace to cast away the works of darkness."

Only by God's grace can we cast away the works of darkness. We must make a decision: to live our lives in God's grace or to live our lives separated from God. If we live our lives separated from God, we live in darkness, not knowing God's grace, trying to find life in all the wrong places, stumbling and falling in the dark. Only by grace can we see our need to cast away the works of darkness, and only a humble heart has room for God's grace. The humility focus is based on Romans 13:11-14. This passage also contains some examples of works of darkness.

"Put on the armor of light."

Theologically speaking, light is God's presence and revelation given to us in His son, Jesus Christ. When we have the presence and revelation of Christ in us, we have God's armor to beat back the works of darkness. Only a person with a humble and repentant heart can take off the clothes of darkness and put on the armor of light.

"Now in the time of this mortal life."

The word "now" means "in the present moment." God is breaking into the present moment calling us to live in the light of Christ. Our current life on earth is a test. Through our free will, we will decide to humble ourselves before Jesus, and let the presence and revelation of Christ lift us into a new life and a new world. In the midst of our problems in "this mortal life," we must see the larger life that Christ wants to bring to us. Now is the time to live this larger life!

All of the above are based on Romans 13:11-14.

The second parts of the prayer focus on glorious majesty:

"he shall come again in his glorious majesty."

The second coming reveals the divine glory of Jesus and his divine kingship over all things. The second coming also brings to completion and perfection the process of salvation. Those that have lived their life humbly before Jesus will welcome Christ's second coming. Those who have lived a life based on pride and selfishness will fear Christ's second coming.

"to judge both the living and the dead"

When Jesus comes again our hearts and our works will stand under his judgement. Each person's life will be exposed for what it really is. Those who have lived for their own glory on earth, rather than live a life to glorify Christ, will have their false glory stripped away. All that is false and evil will be stripped away. The truth about ourselves will become visible. Only what is true and good will survive. The true significance of our lives will be seen. Those who have lived a life in humility before Christ will rejoice at the coming of Christ and look forward to living with Christ in his heavenly kingdom.

That "we may rise to the life immortal"

When live in humility with Christ on earth, he will raise us up in resurrected bodies that will live in his glory for ever and ever. The life on earth was a short test of our willingness to humble and submit ourselves to Jesus. Our lives in heaven will be forever and this is the magnificent life that we have been called to live.

This second coming parts of this prayer are based Mark, Chapter 13.

I hope that you will join me in praying this powerful prayer during this season of Advent. I hope that you will enter into the humility of Christ's first coming and be excited and expectant about the glorious majesty of Christ's second coming. Let Christ come to you this Advent.

## Impactful Witness, Echo, and Scriptual Response talks highlight a spirit-filled Grand Ultreya at St. Andrew's

The fall Grand Ultreya was held on November 23, 2019 at St. Andrew's, La Mesa. Almost 40 people attended and took part in good and plentiful food, fellowship, music, group reunion, Secretariat Elections, and the sharing of God's love and message with others.

The music leader, Alex Tuttle, and her cast of eight other musicians led the crowd in enthusiastic music that lifted the spirits of all. But the witness talks and Fr. Ed Busch's scriptural response touched deeply the hearts of all who were there to hear.

The guest speaker, Herb Kelly, (my brother-in-law), shared how he was called over many years of witnessing the plight of homeless people, to finally do something effective about it. He felt compelled to do something that would get some of these people "out of the dirt." He learned that most homeless people do not get enough sleep because of the insecurity of not having a safe shelter for sleep. Further, that if they could get good sleep for at least a month's time, their minds would change and improve so that they could start functioning again. He just didn't know what he could do about it until a couple of years ago when he saw a group of small "casitas" or shelters that were set on a lot which St. Luke's Episcopal Church uses as a garden. He thought that those shelters were something he could build with his hands. He shared his thought with a friend who told him about the Amikas Project. He got involved with Amikas and within six months was on the Board of that non-profit organization. He shared about a project that is being built at the Meridian Baptist Church campus in El Cajon. This project is designed to provide transitional housing for homeless mothers and their children.

Alex Tuttle gave a brief Echo where she shared how she shares the love of Christ with homeless people she encounters near her work in Downtown San Diego. She explained that people who do not get acknowledged by others-- who do not hear themselves called by their name lose the sense of their humanity. Over time she stepped out in faith and engaged some homeless people whom she recognized near her work. After some time she was able to learn their names and would greet and call them by their names. One day as Alex exited her work's office building carrying a camera to take some pictures for her work, she was greeted by one of her new friends. He posed and asked that she take a picture. She snapped a picture of him and later provided him with a print of the picture. His reaction was one of surprise, joy and pride. Amen.

Fr. Ed Busch thanked Herb for reminding us that faith and professed love of God and love for others lacks substance unless we answer the call to take resolute action when faced with real people with real needs for whom we can do something to help. Herb answered the call in a real way. He showed the love of Jesus, by his decision to act by using his mind, knowledge, and skill to provide housing for these people in need. In the same way Alex answered the call to provide loving acknowledgement to people who are starkly visible, but who are usually treated as if they are invisible. Fr. Ed noted James who said that faith without works is useless. (James 2:20) Fr. Ed exhorted us with this commission from Isaiah 6:8 "And I heard the voice of the Lord say, 'Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?""

And we all said, "Here I am Lord, send me!"
