The Back to the Mountain (BTM) weekend that we attend and enjoy is a very unique ministry. The ministry has prevailed from 1987 to current, 34 years. There are not too many annual weekend ministries that can claim this duration. Attendance to the weekend usually falls between 12 – 25. The weekends are usually held in January as a way to start the new year in community, prayer, reflection, meditation, and love. Many people make the weekend an annual pilgrimage, now to Pine Valley, for the opportunity for renewal, and reconnecting to the larger community with lifelong friends. BTTM – AN HISTORICAL EVENT

SAN DIEGO CURSILLO, BACK TO THE MOUNTAIN, RECEIVES NATIONAL RECOGNITION

The annual National Cursillo Convention was held in 2005 in Seattle, Washington. Many Cursillo Secretariats had heard about our BTTM Weekend, and indicated that they would like to attend a BTTM workshop to find out how we have had this ministry for 18 years running. National Cursillo contacted the San Diego Secretariat for interest in leading a BTTM Workshop in Seattle, and Jeanne and I volunteered.

Seattle was a hoot, including people throwing fish at each other on the docks. But, back to the subject. I was getting estimates from National on the potential number of people that would attend the Workshop. They kept upping the number for us to bring enough handout materials. When we arrived, we were shown the room where we would give the Workshop. It was the second largest room available.

The next day, as we were setting up the Workshop, Convention organizers told us they were moving the Workshop to the big room due to the response of the attending Cursillistas. We packed up, moved, and found out they were going to tape the Workshop and make it available for sale. They took our handouts and copied a bunch more. It was getting out of hand.

The time came to start and the big room was almost filled. We started our presentation and asked to delay questions until we were done. Well, that didn't last long as we were peppered with questions all during the presentation. Based on the questions asked, it became clear to me why there were so many people interested in the workshop.

While everyone there was interested in the BTTM details, many there wanted the answer to: How do you keep people coming back year after year to the same event over 18 years? (now 34 years). We will answer that question later in the presentation.

Some of the other questions that were asked and comments during the presentation were:

- We hold our weekends in our Parish Hall, not a mountain. Can we still call it BTTM?
- January doesn't work for us. Can we hold it some other time and still call it BTTM?
- We started a New Year's Retreat Weekend, but it lasted for only 2-years. What did we do wrong?
- We have a small Cursillo group. Is there a minimum number of people required to hold a BTTM?
- What's the Maximum number of people that can attend?
- You have 3-talks during the weekend. Does it have to be only 3?
- Can we use the BTTM as a logo? Is there any charge?
- Do you have a copyright for BTTM? You should get one.

The presentation, questions and answers lasted way past the workshop time. We were exhausted. We were very popular for the rest of the Convention. People asked more about BTTM and the details of how we hold our weekends. There was much to learn, and much to

teach. It was a wonder experience, and I learned that BTTM was not only a San Diego Cursillo event, but had great value to others beyond our county shores in many ways.

We have attended all BTTM Weekends since 1992, except the 2021 BTTM this June, due to a broken ankle and foot. **We cannot wait to attend the 2022 BTTM Weekend on January 21-23, 2022, at Pine Valley.**

The retreat was the **perfect balance** of worship, group activities and free time for fellowship, reflection and prayer in a beautiful natural environment. It was wonderful to feel the love and support of old and new friends as we shared what we had learned about the power of faith from the hardships and trials of the pandemic. Father George’s sermons helped us to focus on God’s love for us and how faith overcomes fear.

One of the very special treats of the weekend was having Ginny Rodriguez as my roommate. We talked late into the night about our lives like college roomies, but with much more life experiences to share. I have the sense that it was not just coincidental that Ginny and I were thrown together. Something or someone had a hand in arranging this new friendship. I also connected with my fellow Cursillistas who are engaged in healing ministries who offered prayers and support to me in my grieving process that continues beyond the weekend itself.

On the Cursillos in Christianity website, I read this when I signed up for the Back to the Mountain retreat: “The Cursillo experience is fundamentally mysterious because it deals with the most fundamental of all mysteries, which is God.” The Cursillo experience ... can be described ...but must be lived to be appreciated...” This is certainly true for me. The BTTM weekend was truly a timely blessing. I hope and pray that many others will experience this blessing and the mysteries of God’s love for us through this fellowship.

HOW BTTM HAS SURVIVED FOR 34 YEARS RUNNING **WHAT'S THE SECRET?**

Following are some of the thoughts and facts presented at the 2005 National Cursillo Convention's workshop on BTTM, attempting to write down the answer to the question:

What's the secret?

The original BTTM 1987, started at noon on Saturday, and ended after lunch on Sunday. This was quickly changed to include Friday evening and end late Sunday morning after Eucharist. Either three or four talks were given, with three becoming the standard. Over the early years the weekend agenda was standardized with each Rector and Rector creating activities to complement their Theme for the weekend (See Appendix #1 to view a standard weekend format with Theme.)

I was going to detail the agenda items as I did in Seattle, but my bottom line summary in Seattle said it all. I was astounded when I first read the article in this Forward from Jill Kerper Mora, who attended her first BTTM, and virtually nailed my Workshop Summary:

*“ BTTM is a gift from God, to be with His people through the Holy Spirit, during the New Year. He inspired us to develop, and practice, the **perfect balance** of worship, group and individual activities, free time for fellowship and meditation, with reflection and prayer, all in the environment of His beautiful outdoor creation.*

Each BTTM Weekend has the same format and balance, but each BTTM weekend is based on a new Theme, making each weekend totally unique, and to be cherished.”

This is the secret of our God given everlasting ministry we call,

“Back to the Mountain.”
