Jesus, the Incarnate Word of God

John 1:14 And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth.

The Word incarnate means embodied in flesh.

Because Jesus is God's Word in the flesh, He is God's Word incarnate. As Jesus speaks and acts, God's Word is alive and lived out in the world. In the New Testament texts about Jesus, we can see God's Word as the embodied Word, the Word becomes a real living human being. Through Jesus we can have a personal relationship with the Word of God.

John 1:1-18 is the prologue to the Gospel that describes Jesus, the incarnate Word of God. In this prologue the incarnate Word directly or indirectly incorporates three previous revelations of the Word of God.

1. The Word of God before and during creation of the Universe, Genesis 1.
2. The Word of God in the revelation of the law to Moses especially the Ten Commandments, Exodus 20.
3. The Word of God revealed through the prophets.

1) The prologue of the Gospel John starts with these famous words:

"In the Beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." "He was in the Beginning with God."

"All things came into being through Him and without Him not one thing came into being."

The Word present before creation speaks creation into existence. God acts when he speaks, God's Word is powerful, the Word created the universe. God's Word comes to us through creation, but we can't know much about God through creation. God is largely hidden behind the creation. In the Biblical history of the Jewish people, God's Word would be revealed and then culminate in the Word incarnate in Jesus.

2) The Gospel of John tells us in verse 17:

"The law indeed was given through Moses; Grace and Truth came through Jesus Christ."

This draws a contrast between the law given through Moses and the Grace and Truth given to us through Jesus Christ. The law shows us our need for God because we cannot live up to its requirements. The Grace and Truth of Christ fulfill the law for us. It is Jesus Christ in us who we need in order to live out the requirements of the law. The moral law shows us that we are sinners and that we can't keep the law under our own power. It shows us our need for God. God's word as moral law is not our salvation. It shows us our need for Jesus, the Word incarnate, who will bring salvation.

3) God's Word as prophecy. The prophets showed how the people of Israel fell short of what God's commandments required and dreamed of a future in which God would send a Messiah to fulfill the goodness contained in these commandments. Now back to Jesus the incarnate Word of God.

God sends the Messiah. Jesus, God's Word incarnate, fulfills the Word in creation, the Word in the moral law, the Word in the prophecy of the prophets, the Word incarnate in Jesus is the culmination and fulfillment of these previous Words.

In Jesus the Word of God is incarnate and, as individuals, we can encounter God's Word as a real loving person. Jesus is now risen from the dead, we encounter the risen person, and then look back at his incarnate existence in the New Testament.

In a few weeks, Advent and Christmas will be upon us. These seasons help us think about the mystery of Jesus, the incarnate Word. I hope that my rambling meditation will inspire you to rethink and have a deeper understanding of Jesus, the Incarnate Word.

There are two Grand Ultreyas held every year as part of your Cursillo's Fourth Day. 2022 is no exception. At noon on Saturday, November 19, 2022, at St. Andrew's, La Mesa, this year's Fall Grand Ultreya and Secretariat Election started as usual with a potluck. However this potluck featured a special dessert cake with a Champagne Toast in honor of Larry Salvadori. Larry recently retired from the Cursillo Ministry after 30 years of service.

Larry's impact on the ministry has been widespread and phenomenal. Whenever ideas to improve or promote the Cursillo ministry were needed, Larry came up with great ideas and had the energy and resolute actions to implement them. The Cursillo Celebration highlighting the 46th anniversary of Cursillo in our Diocese is a recent example. Rollistas over many years benefited from his gentle and precise suggestions to improve their rolls at the Rollo Critiques that he hosted and led for many years.

Whenever there were challenges, be they minor or major, Cursillo benefited from solutions promulgated by Larry. The San Diego Episcopal Cursillo became well known nationally for its consistent holding of Cursillo Weekends and Fourth Day Activities over the years while other Cursillo movements in many dioceses succumbed to the same challenges. Larry was a major force of the ideas and encouraging energy to meet and overcome the challenges,

...The Witness Talk

The Witness Talk was given before a crowd of over 40 people by Herb Kelly from St. Dunstan's. Herb spoke about Amikas, a non-profit ministry that develops portable sleeping cabins for homeless women with children. Herb became involved with the ministry when he was referred to it by a friend whom he has known since their elementary school days at All Saints School. At the time Amikas had built little cabins on the plot of land at St. Luke's in North Park, When Herb saw the cabins he knew he could help with his construction skills and he signed up with the ministry on the spot. He is now a board member of Amikas.

Herb previously shared about the Amikas ministry at the fall 2019 Grand Ultreya. This talk was an update and a sharing about the just approved for opening sleeping cabin village at Meridian Baptist Church in El Cajon. The project took over 2 1/2 years to work through the El Cajon City Council and San Diego County governmental agencies. The mothers and children will benefit with shelter and safety, a time for rest and comfort, food and facilities for personal care needs, and other benefits provided by a collaboration of the Meridian Baptist Church, The City of El Cajon, the County and other agencies.

St. Dunstan's and the Church of The Good Shepherd Episcopal Churches have donated funds for the construction of the Amikas sleeping cabins.

The Echo Talk

Ruben Rodriguez, from Good Shepherd gave a talk that focused on the blessings resulting from legacy giving.

The source of Good Shepherd's donation to the Amikas ministry was a "gift to the needy" made about 22 years ago by the Estate of Kay Upstill. Kay Upstill was a retired teacher who lived a very modest life but made a substantial donation to the Church through her will. As is the case when any of us gives of ourselves to anyone in need, we do not know the full impact of that gift—it could redound for the benefit of people we don't even know—it could be life enhancing or even life saving.

The Scriptural Response

Fr. Carlos Garcia gave the Scriptural Response noting that ministry and gifts to the needy is the ministry of Jesus.


