
This message to the San Diego Episcopal Cursillo community is my last message in my role as Secretariat President 2023. It has been an honor and privilege to serve God and our Cursillo community in this position. At our Secretariat retreat in January 2024 our President-elect, Ginny Rodriguez assumes responsibility as President.

Here, I wish to share some reflections on our ministry and our accomplishments and challenges this past year. To begin my year of service, I led the Secretariat in praying in a new Cursillo rooster, who we affectionately named Señor Gallo

Sr. Gallo has served us well as a symbol of Cursillo at our Secretariat meetings and other important events. It has been great fun reminding each other of the origin of the rooster as a representative of our ministry from the song De Colores... "Canta el gallo..." The rooster's song expresses the beauty of a new morning and the splendor of God's creation that we celebrate as Cursillistas with our commitment to spreading the light and love of our Lord Jesus Christ in the world. The second word that we understand is agape, a Greek word, unconditional love. which means expecting nothing in return. Agape is gift is freely given to when a someone without expectations. The rabbis, when translating the Testament from Hebrew into Greek. shortly before the time of Jesus, chose the word agape in lieu of the word hesed. Both hesed and agape tell us of God's love towards us, but are also the kind of love we should have towards God and towards other people. Jesus is the ultimate

revelation of hesed and agape. As our mediator, our advocate, and our savior. He is both the model and the means of hesed and agape.

should We note that the Greek language has many words for love.

#### These are:

- eros "romantic love;
- philia "affectionate love;"
- storge "familiar love;"
- pragma "enduring love;"
- philautia "self-love / selfcompassion;"
- ludas "playful love;" and
- agape "unconditional Love."

When agapan is used in the New Testament, it is used exclusively as a religious word. It is a God-like love. It refers to God's love flowing to us, or through us towards others. It is by God's grace that we enter into the agapan love. It goes beyond the types of love that come naturally to us. In the church we offer ourselves to Jesus and learn how to do acts of agapan love.

The Rectors for Cursillo Weekend #150, Darryl and Barbara Peralta, gave Witness and Echo Talks, respectively, based on the Theme of this Ultreya and of the upcoming Cursillo Weekend: "Be still and know that I am God." Psalm 46:10. Darryl sought to speak about "know that I am God."

He noted that one of the purposes of Cursillo is to help Cursillistas to develop and deepen their relationship with God. To really know God one needs to interact in some way with Him. This involves two-way communication. Darryl shared seven such incidences in his life. Here are a few.

<u>Our plans might not be God's plans</u>--While getting dressed to serve as an acolyte one Sunday, he couldn't find the carefully selected cross he had brought from home for the occasion, so reluctantly wore the regular acolyte cross. When he returned to the sacristy after the service, there was his "coordinated cross" hanging on the doorknob in plain sight. God is the one in control. Not Darryl.

<u>The Creator is greater than the creature</u>—-Sitting in his back yard one day, he watched a hummingbird deftly dancing in the air, flitting about in the amazing way (continued on p. 6)

hummingbirds do. Just then a jet liner from Lindbergh Field flew overhead. Man understands and can make planes fly, but can't make them fly like a hummingbird.

<u>God can do the things we can't</u>--Darryl smoked for over 40 years and tried to quit twice without success. One day at work he felt what he thought was heart burn. When he mentioned this while getting coffee, a medic there told him to get himself immediately to the ER. He was having a heart attack. He spent 10 days in the hospital after surgery, and hasn't had even an urge to smoke since.

God can show his love through others—Darryl and his family, grandchildren included, went to see the Polar Bears at the San Diego Zoo. As they made their way up the very steep hill on the way back, he tried not to show how hard the climb was for him, owing to his lung and heart issues. He lagged behind, but became aware of a presence behind him. He turned back to find two of his grandchildren there making sure Grandpa made it up the hill safely.

Barbara started her talk with the admission that when she climbed the hill after seeing the polar bears, two of her grandchildren had to push her up the hill. Barbara's talk focused on the "Be Still" part of the verse. She shared about a time when they were transferred by the Navy to South Carolina. She was Ombudsman for Darryl's ship to the wives of the enlisted crew. When she would receive a disheartening message like, "Ship delayed 6 more weeks," this was an opportunity to "Be Still" and wait, and encourage the other wives to do the same.

Barbara shared when she and Darryl went to the Cursillo Retreat, "Back To The Mountain" she was surprised when asked, "Ready to give your Rollo?" Initially, anxiety set in, but she again was reminded to "Be Still". She secluded herself, missed some meals, but finished the rollo at the last minute.

In recent example, Darryl and Barbara were unexpectedly asked to be rectors of Cursillo #150. This was yet another chance to be still, commit everything to prayer, and listen to God.

Barbara's last example was about having waited 7 years for a family member to make contact with her. It began when she served as the trustee of a deceased brother's estate. Once she had finished the administration and distribution of the estate, her younger brother did not speak to her or communicate in any way after that. It worried Barbara that she did not know the reason why. Finally, after 7 years he responded. Her lesson from that experience was: be patient, be still, and know that God is with you always. This Weekend was very special in many ways, but I was personally inspired by the way our Team was able to provide a bilingual, bicultural weekend. The Cursillo community generously donated new upgraded simultaneous translation equipment that enabled us to conduct the Weekend in both English and Spanish. This fulfillment of the Lord's calling to us to reach out to the nations included bilingual table leaders and of course, our beloved bilingual clergy, Fr. Carlos García, Fr. Roberto Maldonado, and Mother Lilia Mendoza. The Secretariat is gratified to affirm the Rt. Rev.
